I would like to encourage all children at our school to participate in the Premier's Reading Challenge 2023.

I have included a copy of **some** of the rules for the Challenge and a Reading Record sheet. If after reading the complete list of the Rules of the Challenge on the PRC website <u>https://online.det.nsw.edu.au/prc/home.html</u> you would like your child to participate in the challenge, please complete the slip below and return it to their class teacher.

I will need a printed copy of your child's completed Online Student Reading Log, for checking purposes, no later than 18th August 2023. After this date students will

not be able to access the site to enter their books.

Please do not leave entering their logs to the last minute and use your child's "det" username & password for this current year to log on to the website.

When I receive a printed log your child will receive a bookmark to acknowledge the completion of the Challenge. At the end of the year successful students will receive a certificate from the Premier of NSW.

To avoid disappointment, start now and there'll be no rush at the end!

Students must complete a set amount of reading from the booklist as outlined in the table below.

A full booklist is available at the Premier's Reading Challenge website.

For those who do not have access to the internet at home, I have added to our books, the PRC ID code on the inside of the front cover of the book, to assist you.

I have also prepared all our PRC books from the booklist by placing **a coloured dot on the spine of the book**. This assists our children when they are selecting and borrowing.

Premier's Reading Challenge 2023

- 1. The Challenge runs from 27 February to 18 August <u>2023. Access to the site closes for students on 18th August</u> <u>2023.</u> Ongoing reading is encouraged. Books read from 1 September 2022 can count towards the 2023 Challenge.
- 2. It is a condition of entry that students entering and successfully completing the Premier's Reading Challenge will receive an official PRC certificate and their names will appear on the PRC Honour Roll (see <u>rule 5</u>).
- 3. Teachers, Teacher Librarians and public librarians can assist students to choose the Challenge level and books that are appropriate for their age, interest and maturity levels. K–2 students who can read simple chapter books independently are encouraged to attempt the 3-4 Challenge.
- 4. Students must complete a set amount of reading to meet the Challenge, see table on the previous page.
- 5. Special Notes
 - Independent K-2 readers may attempt the 3-4 Challenge.
 - To experience a book a child can listen to the book, participate in a shared reading of the book or read part or all- of- the book independently.
 - Students in Kindergarten-Year 2 can experience PRC books in their home language.
 - For students in Years 3 to 9, all books selected from PRC booklists should be read in English.
 - Students in Years 3-9 can read choice books in their home language.
 - For students using PRC 5-6 & 7-9 booklists, the electronic PRC <u>School Magazine</u> anthologies can be read as up to two PRC books.
 - For students using the PRC 5-6 & 7-9 booklists, collections of *The Sun-Herald* <u>newspaper articles</u> can be chosen as up to two PRC books.
 - Students who require special support may listen to unabridged audio versions of the books as they read along to them.
- 6. All Student Reading Logs need to be entered online on the NSW Premier's Reading Challenge website after school registration which is 01/Mar/2023. Students can enter their books online as they read them by using their own school det log in "username" and "password" that they use to access the computers at school. Please see the class teacher for this.

The electronic Student Reading Log is completed by either entering the PRC ID number of each book or clicking on titles from a drop-down PRC list. Many choice books can also be selected from a drop-down list <u>or added to their lists</u> by following the prompts. <u>Please refer to all the FAQ's on the website</u>.

- 7. <u>To successfully complete the Challenge students must have their online reading record entered by 18th August</u> 2023 so that the Teacher Librarian can validate the entry.
- 8. Schools registering students must ensure that a parent/caregiver understands that all students entering the Premier's Reading Challenge will receive a PRC certificate and appear in the PRC Honour Roll. The certificate shows the student's name and school. Only the students' name will appear in the Honour Roll with no other identifying factors. Participating schools appear as a separate list and home schools are not listed individually.

Students who <u>do not</u> wish to receive a certificate <u>or</u> be on the Honour Roll should not register for the Challenge. These students may do the Challenge unofficially, they may use the PRC booklists and can seek recognition in their local school community but they cannot enter an official record.

- 9. A reading log can be used to keep a personal ongoing record of books read (ID number, title and author). Students will also need to supply information on whether they have completed the Challenge before and if it was at a different school. This information must be entered on the online Student Reading Log.
- 10. Paper copies are not submitted to the PRC. Personal reading logs may be kept by schools for their records.
- Students, whose online entries are validated by their school by the 28th August 2023, will have their certificates sent to their schools in Term 4.
- 12. Only one certificate per year will be issued to each student regardless of the number of books read.
- 13. Students who complete the Challenge for four years receive a Gold Certificate and for seven years it's a Platinum Certificate.
