We will be launching the app at the beginning of term two.

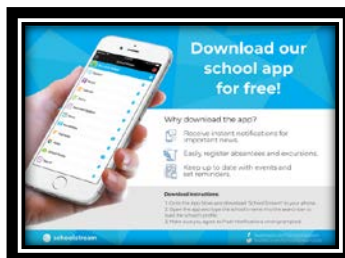
The school stream app streamlines the communication of news, alerts, notices, events, notes, reminders and more from school, to parents, saving both parties precious time and a whole lot more.

Naplan

Next week the 2019 National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) will be completed by students in Years 3 and 5. NAPLAN has the support of all State and Territory Education Ministers and will assess the literacy and numeracy skills of students across Australian schools. The results of the tests will provide important information to schools about what each student can do, and will be used to support teaching and learning programs. Parents will receive a report indicating their child's level of achievement against the national minimum standard.

The NAPLAN tests will be conducted from 14 -16 May 2019.

- Tuesday 14 May - Language Conventions (Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar) and Writing
- Wednesday 15 May - Reading
- Thursday 16 May - Numeracy

Good luck to our Year 3 and 5 students who are sitting NAPLAN tests next week. I'm sure your hard work will be rewarded.
