YEAR 4'S TRIP TO THE JANNALI HIGH SCHOOL (TJHS)

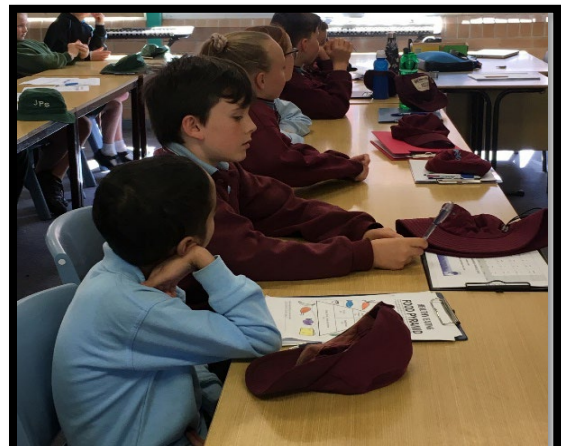
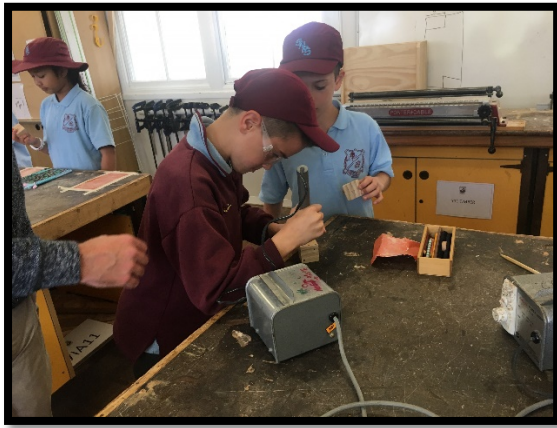

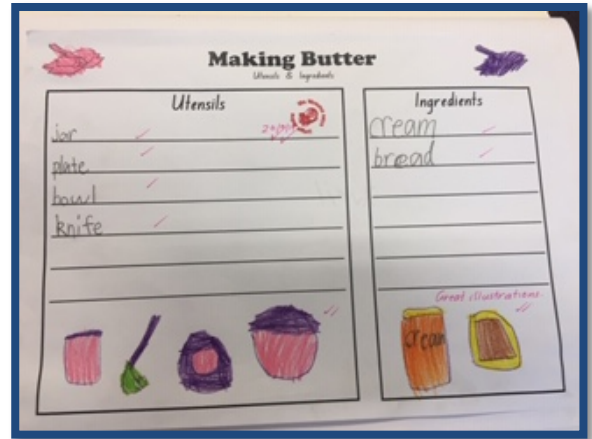
We split into four groups and did six half an hour rotations of subjects that you do when you are in high school including: PE, Music, Food Technology, Industrial Arts, STEM and Language. In PE, we did relay races with different sports involved in one game. In our Music lesson, we learnt how to play some beats on an African drum, the beats were bass, tone and slap. In Food Technology, we made milkshakes with the help of two Year 10 students that attend the school, while talking about the right foods to eat and the daily amount of what you should have. What we did in Industrial Arts was make a die with a cube of wood. We had to burn the wood with a hot wood burner to make the dots on the dice and use garnet paper to smooth the edges and corners. In STEM we designed our own planes and got wooden planes that were made by a very cool **LASER CUTTER**. We thank Mr Coleman, Mrs Minogue and the TJHS students for the trip! At the end of the day we all had fun and hope to go there again someday!

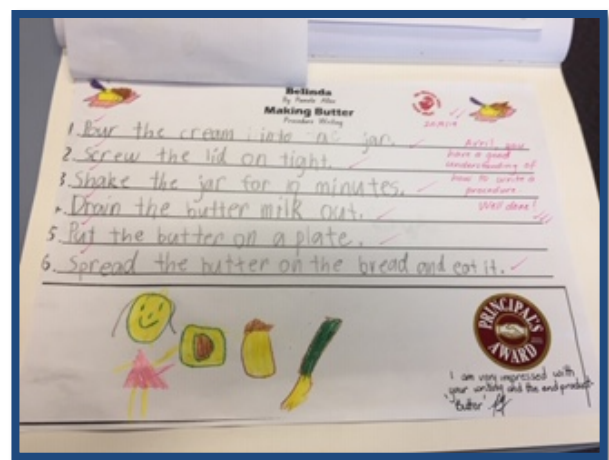
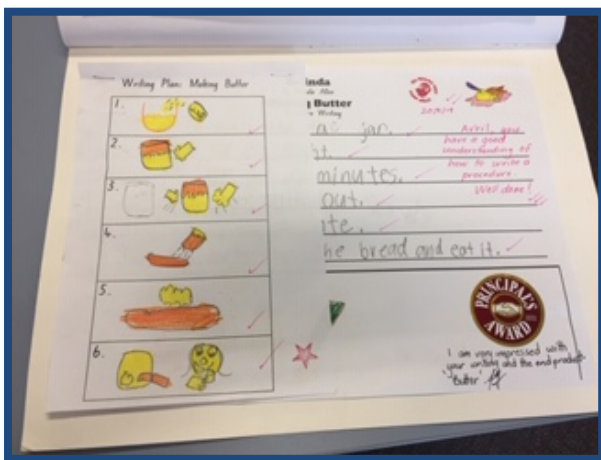

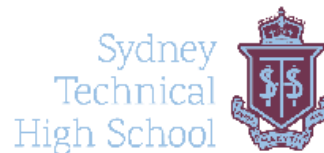
