Industrial Action

On 21 June the NSW Teachers Federation directed its members to strike for 24 hours on Thursday 30 June 2022.

While our school will still be open, we will be only be providing minimal supervision of students on this date as a result of the strike. Minimal supervision means a modified timetable required to meet safety and supervision requirements.

Our focus remains the learning and wellbeing of our students. The department is prioritising work to resolve a new Teachers Award, with dates for arbitration in the Industrial Relations Commission reserved for October.

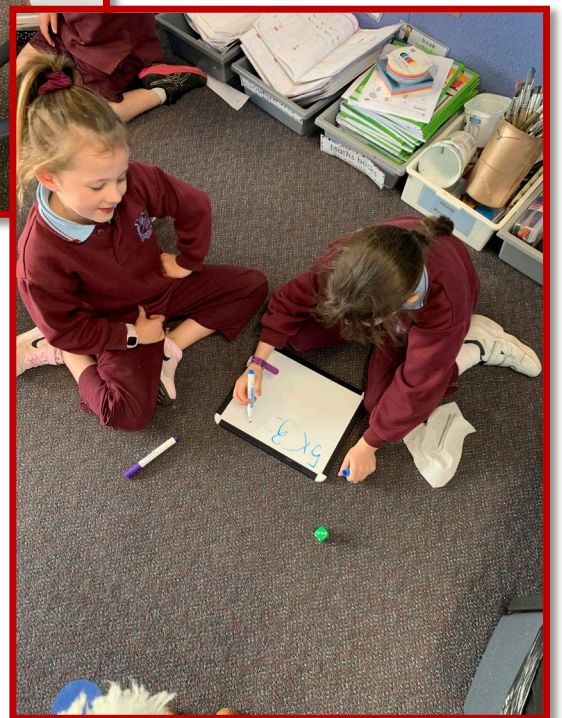


Well done to Isabelle who was selected in the Sydney East Basketball Team and competed at the NSW PSSA State Championships held in Tamworth
