Identification of Student Needs

This is achieved through:

- Professional conversations and consultation with staff who are familiar with students
- Has the student been taught by the teacher in previous years
- Academic and welfare data
- Learning adjustment requirements
- Student friendships, personalities
- Students educational history
- Behaviour support
- Gender balance
- Significant information that may be provided by parents of educational reasoning (history, social and emotional factors).

Allocation of Teachers

This is determined after a consultative process that takes into consideration:

- Teacher preferences
- Past experience
- Skill and expertise
- Professional learning goals
- Effective balanced stage teams
- New teachers to the school and/or Graduate Teachers
- Requests for particular teachers will not be considered and is discouraged.

We appreciate that you trust our professional judgement taking into account the multitude of factors that influence the placement of over 260 children. If you feel there is information of educational reasoning that should be considered for 2019 classes, you are welcome to put this in writing to the Principal by 3pm Friday 23 November.

Students in 3/4Y participate in 'Literacy Centre Rotations' each week. As the teacher works with one group of students for guided reading, other groups rotate through the literacy centres in the classroom. It is designed to provide appropriate materials to help students work independently or collaboratively (with partners or in small groups) to meet literacy goals. Literacy centres allow for student choice, have explicit and ongoing routines. Literacy centres promote student collaboration, facilitate student motivation, and provide targeted practice for students.
